

PUBLIC MEETING: MEDLOCK BRIDGE & STATE BRIDGE ROAD IMPROVEMENTS UPDATE

A public meeting was held on October 2, 2025, at 6 p.m. at Johns Creek City Hall to share updates on the Medlock Bridge and State Bridge Road Improvements Project. If approved, the project will add a third left-turn lane on Southbound Medlock Bridge, a third northbound through lane, and a right-turn lane. These improvements aim to reduce congestion, improve traffic flow, and enhance walkability.

MEDLOCK CORNERS CONSTRUCTION UPDATE

- Construction is active at Medlock Corners Shopping Center. The northeast corner of Medlock & State Bridge.
- A new coffee shop is being built in the parking lot, across from Hobby Lobby.
- The former bank building has been approved for a new Whataburger restaurant.
- Site upgrades will also include improved traffic flow, sidewalks, and a new seating area with benches to enhance walkability.

PLANNED PEDESTRIAN TRAIL AND TRAFFIC IMPROVEMENTS ON NESBIT FERRY ROAD

City staff have recommended authorizing \$200,000 for engineering design of a new pedestrian trail along the east (Johns Creek) side of Nesbit Ferry Road. Currently, Nesbit Ferry Road (between Holcomb Bridge Road and Old Alabama Road) lacks consistent sidewalks or pedestrian pathways. This proposed trail would significantly improve safety and connectivity for residents walking, jogging, or biking along this busy corridor. The project is being developed in partnership with the city of Roswell.

BARNWELL ROAD IMPROVEMENTS MOVING FORWARD

The City of Johns Creek has approved construction for the Barnwell Road Corridor. Improvements, including upgrades at the Niblick Drive intersection and a new multi-use trail from Niblick Drive to North Peak Drive. The project, totaling \$8.9 million, won't require new local taxes. These enhancements will add a shared-use path for walkers and cyclists, improve traffic flow and safety, and upgrade drainage and utility lines. Construction is expected to begin after final permitting, and residents may see temporary lane closures during work.

Every year, the Board reviews our infrastructure needs to determine what maintenance or replacement projects should be prioritized. These decisions are guided by regular inspections, professional assessments, and reserve studies that estimate the remaining life and replacement cost of major assets. The goal is to balance today's expenses with tomorrow's needs — maintaining

our community's appearance and safety while keeping assessments stable and predictable.

Preventive maintenance is key to controlling costs. A modest investment in road sealing, stormwater upkeep, or drainage clearing today can prevent far more expensive repairs later. That's why you'll see infrastructure planning built into both the operating budget and the reserve fund.

As you review this year's proposed budget, remember that infrastructure isn't just about concrete, pipes, and pavement — it's about protecting property values, ensuring safety, and sustaining the quality of life we all enjoy. A well-maintained community reflects thoughtful financial stewardship and shared commitment from every homeowner.



ST IVES RESIDENTS - DON'T FORGET TO VOTE!

The Municipal Election for Mayor and Posts 1, 3, 5 will be Tuesday, Nov. 4 with early voting to be held Tuesday, Oct. 14 through Friday, Oct. 31. If necessary, a runoff will be Tuesday, Dec. 2. Johns Creek Municipal Elections are non-partisan. Candidates run at-large and the candidate who receives the majority of votes cast wins their respective seat. Public Officials have staggered four-year terms, with elections every two years (Post 2, 4 and 6) and (Post 1, 3, 5 and Mayor). The Mayor and Council members serve for no more than three consecutive terms.

MAYOR: JOHN BRADBERRY (INCUMBENT) VS. KELLY STEWART

John Bradberry, who has served as Mayor since 2021, points to Johns Creek's continued status as one of Georgia's safest and most desirable cities. He emphasizes fiscal restraint, efficient government, and "smart, strategic growth" that preserves neighborhood character while expanding parks, trails, and quality-of-life amenities.

Kelly Stewart seeks to bring a new leadership style to City Hall, focusing on collaboration, staff retention, and improved communication. She highlights teamwork, transparency, and restoring decorum on the Council.

Anita Gupta calls for stronger fiscal oversight and transparency. She supports fully funding police and fire while expressing caution toward large capital projects she believes could strain long-term budgets.

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




























ENJOY A NIGHT AT THE FOX



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
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
